

Vikings move into second place tie

Vernon Vikings moved into a second place tie with Penticton Broncos, in the interior division of the B.C. Junior Hockey League, with a 5-1 victory over Chilliwack Bruins Sunday, in Vernon.

The victory gave Vikings 15 points, five less than first place Kelowna Buckaroos.

Darrell Booth opened the scoring for Vernon at 12:59 of the first period, on a power play.

His goal was followed in the second period by counters from Bill Ranson, Brad Schultz, Dwight Bailey, and Ron Areshenkoff.

Score was tied 3-3 after the second period in Kelowna, and Bucks' sixth goal was into the empty net.

Archie McKinnon led the Bucks with two goals while Gord Dumont, Perry Schnaar, Duane Monteith, and Gene Weninger added singles.
