

## THIRD CONSECUTIVE WIN

# Vikings down Chilliwack

CHILLIWACK (Staff) — Vernon Vikings recorded their third consecutive win Thursday when they defeated Chilliwack Bruins 6-4 before 650 fans in Chilliwack Colliseum.

Vikings trailed 2-1 at the end of the first period but led 3-2 after 40 minutes. Bruins took the lead 4-3 briefly early in the third, but Vikings scored three unanswered goals to round out the scoring.

Tom O'Neill and Al Cyr scored for Chilliwack, while Greg Walmsley replied for Vernon in the first period.

Grant Sidnick and Gary Gilchrist put Vernon ahead during the middle. Jim Slater and Vern Quaroni gave Bruins the short-lived third period lead.

Ron Areshenkoff tied the score at 2:10 of the third period, while Dwight Bailey rounded out the scoring with goals at 5:50 and 19:58. Bailey's final goal was into the empty net.

Vikings' netminder Jim Scammel made 34 saves while Dennis Welsh in the

Chilliwack nets turned away 28 shots.
