Alan Young, Brad Gassoff, Jim McAlony, Reg Kerr and Darryl Ferner replied for Kamloops.

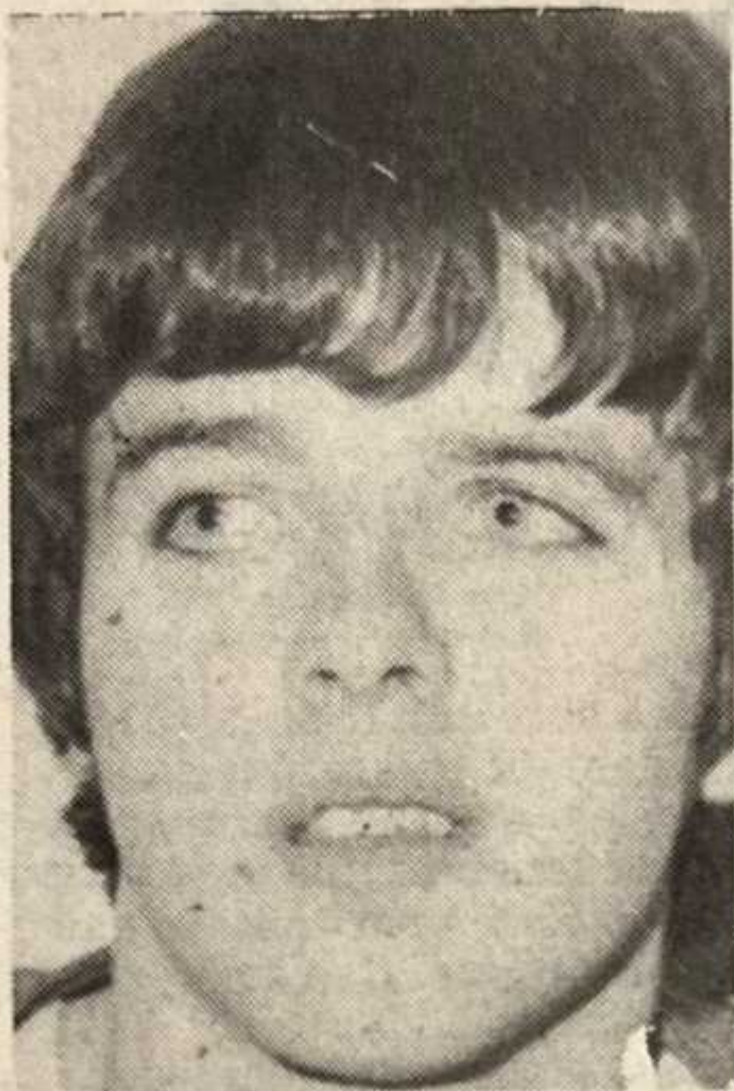
Stan Gulutzan scored twice for the Blades while Glen Leggett, Del Chapman and Bryon Baron had the others.
