## Vernon tames Kelowna with 6-5 overtime win

Outshot 47-37 by Kelowna Buckaroos and trailing in the first two periods, Vernon Vikings came on strong Friday night, forced the game into overtime and won a hard-fought 6-5.

Darrel Booth scored the winning goal at 6:49 in overtime. Ron Areshenkoff scored twice, and singles were netted by Marty Stein, Brad Schultz and Gary Gilchrist.

### ROUGH RIDE

Scoring for Kelowna were Doug Barry, Doug Davis, Rick Benningshoff, Bill Hayes and Perry Schnarr.

Buckaroos gave Vernon a rough ride for the first two periods of play leading 3-1 at the end of the first, and 4-3 after the second. Shots were raining on the Viking goal, but the team rallied in the third and kayoed the Kelowna team with a shot from Booth.

Buckaroos remain in first place in the British Columbia Junior Hockey League's Interior play, with Vernon 12 points behind, trailed by Penticton with 26 points and Merritt with 17.

In other league play, home teams struck it lucky. Langley Lords trampled Merritt Centennials 13-4 and Penticton Broncos skated over Bellingham Blazers 5-1.

Playing in Penticton, the Broncos took a 2-0 lead in the opening period and then increased their lead to 4-0 in the second.

Kirk Aulin, Greg Milliard, Rod Zavaduk, Bob Irving and Del Iannone handled the scoring for the Broncos. Kevin Krook scored for Bellingham.

The Broncos held a marked edge offensively as Jack Anderson and Carey Walker faced 42 shots in the Bellingham net while Penticton netminder Dennis Ewanchuk handled 21 shots.

In Langley, Terry Tarnow scored three goals to lead the Lords. Lane Lavik, Sandy Bain and Mark Taylor had two each with singles coming from Lori Sail, Kerry Gladson,

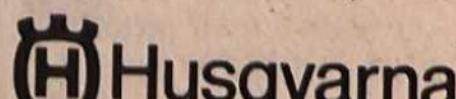
