

# Blazers hold Vikings to tie — outshot 57-28

Chilliwack Bruins regained sole possession of first place in the coast division of the British Columbia Junior Hockey League with an 8-2 victory Saturday over the Langley Lords.

Despite being outshot 57-28, Bellingham Blazers managed a 3-3 tie with Vernon Vikings Sunday. Vernon is in second place in the interior division, seven points behind Kelowna, while Bellingham is the coastal division's fourth spot with 13 points.

Bellingham was beaten Saturday as well when two powerplay goals from Bill Haynes in the third period led Kelowna Buckaroos to a 3-2 victory.

A coaching change hours before the game didn't help Nanaimo Clippers Saturday night when they dropped a 5-3 decision to Merritt Centennials.

But the Clippers and their new coaches, Bud Dumont and Earl Robinson, came back to score six straight goals and

edge the Bruins 7-6 Sunday night in Nanaimo. The Clippers are in last place in the coast division with eight points.

In Chilliwack Saturday Tom Zelke led the Bruins with four goals. Singles went to Gary Huth, Al Cunningham, Brent Enquist and Vern Quaroni. Terry Tarnow and Dwayne Lowdermilk scored for Langley.
