

Vikings No. 2 with double win

Two wins here during the weekend lifted the Vernon Vikings into second place in the point standings of the B.C. Junior Hockey League's Interior Division, one point ahead of the Penticton Broncos.

Vernon defeated Merritt 10-3 Sunday in a game marred by nine game misconducts and a fight in the stands.

The Vikings beat the Nanaimo Clippers 7-4 Saturday, with Gary Gilchrist leading the team with four goals.

Vernon now has 36 points,

while first-place Kelowna Buckaroos have 50. Penticton is in third place with 35 points and the Centennials have 27.

In the coast division, Langley Lords led with 37 points, followed by Chilliwack Bruins with 32, Bellingham Blazers with 29 and Nanaimo Clippers with 20.

The fighting in the Vikings game Sunday began when Vernon's Greg Walmsley and Merritt's Stan Alsted began punching at each other during the third period. Gilchrist and the Centennial's Lloyd Nordstrom also began fighting.

The disturbance spread to the ice when a Vikings fan and Greg Shannon, a reporter for the weekly Merritt Herald, started exchanging blows. Seven Merritt players crossed

the ice to go to the aid of the reporter.

Gilchrist and Walmsley were also assessed game misconducts.

Only one goal — by Vernon's

Jeff Boychuk, his second of the night — was scored during the penalty-ridden final frame.

The Vikings were in control of the game for much of its 60 minutes, scoring six goals in the first period and another three in the second.

Gilchrist, Brad Schultz, Grant Sidnick, Boychuk, Gary Gassoff, and Jack Lefley scored for the Vikings during the first period. Bob Peebles and Neil Robinson replied for the Centennials, making the score 6-2.

Marty Stein, Lefley, and Dwight Bailey scored for Vernon in the second period. The lone Merritt marker was scored by Perry Stensland.

In Saturday's game, the line of Gilchrist, Walmsley and Ron Areshenokoff picked up a total of 14 points.

Gilchrist put three consecutive goals past Nanaimo's goalie, Dan Rogers, during the first and second periods, and scored his fourth goal during the third period.

Vernon led 2-0 after the first period. The first Merritt marker, at 4:02 of the second, was contested by the Vikings, who said the whistle had blown before the puck went into the net, but Ron McConnell was credited with the goal.

LONG SHOT

After Gilchrist's third goal, Nanaimo's Kim Hilkewich made it 3-2 with a long shot that beat Darrell Furmanek in the Vikings nets.

Bob Burgoyne tied the score for Nanaimo when he stole the puck from Vernon's Owen Lloyd at the Nanaimo blueline and scored an unassisted goal.

In the third period, Dwight, Baley, Greg Walmsley, Grant Sidnick and Gilchrist scored for the Vikings, while John Gordon scored for Nanaimo.

In other games during the weekend, Bellingham beat Langley 9-3 Sunday and Penticton defeated Nanaimo 12-4.

CHILLIWACK EDGED

Saturday, Langley edged Chilliwack 5-4. Lori Cail spearheaded the Langley attack with two goals. Singles were added by Randy Larson, Lane Lavik, and Kelly Farner.
