Cancer claims

Scotty

One of the most respected hockey men in Western Canada, Scotty Munro died Friday night in Calgary Hospital.

He had been suffering from cancer.

Munro, manager and owner of the Calgary Centennials of the Western Canada Hockey League, sent perhaps as many players to the pro hockey ranks as any junior manager in Canada.

Vernon Vikings' Coach Joe Tennant, who for years has been a close friend of Munro, said Scotty was not only a fine hockey man, but a great person.
