The win moved Merritt into sole possession of first place in the league's interior division, two points ahead of Kelowna.

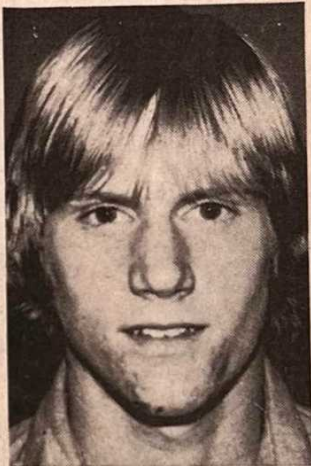
