Vikings alone in first

Vernon Vikings moved into sole possession of first place in the Interior Division of the B.C. Junior Hockey League with a 7-4 victory over Kelowna Buckaroos before 1,250 fans Saturday at the Vernon Civic Arena.

Vikings overcame an early 3-9 deficit to stop Kelowna's seven-game winning streak. The win gives Vernon 18 points, two more than the Bucks. Pentticon Vees have 15 points and Merritt Centennials trail with 14.

Nanaimo Clippers helped out the Vikings by edging Merritt 5-4 on Saturday, and Kelowna 5-4 on Sunday, in Enderby.

Veteran defenceman Brian Grisee had his first-ever three goal game for Vernon. Grisee, 20, played a standout offensive game, moving the puck out of the defensive end with authority.

Ken Oulton, Darcy Wilkinson, Steve Danshin, and Drew Tumbach scored the other Vikings' goals.

Perry Schnarr, top goal scorer in the BCJHL last season, counted three times for the Bucks while Rob Wright added a single.

Vikings were extremely sloppy in the early going as the seven icing calls in the first period, indicated.

Kelowna came out flying and Schnarr's powerplay goal at 12:17 of the first period gave Bucks a 3-0 lead. But, a beautiful shot from the point by Oulton, at 16:25, put Vernon on the scoreboard and seemed to change the momentum of the game.

Kelowna led 3-2 at the end of the first period but Vikings held a 6-4 lead after the second.

After a bit of a shaky start, Darrell Furmanek in the Vernon net, came on strong and finished the night with 22 saves. John McKerrow and Claude Bertoli combined to block 32 shots for the Buckaroos.

The game was not the usual rock 'em, sock 'em Kelowna-Vernon contest. Vikings were assessed seven of only 11

minor penalties handed out. Vikings' Coach Joe Tennant praised Furmanek, who got off to a slow start this season.

Tennant said, "I was particularly pleased with the win considering we were missing both wingers off the first line." Grant Sidnick is out with cracked ribs and Jack Lefley has been called up by Medicine Hat.

Vikings are off until Saturday when they host Langley Lords.

Murdoch had four goals and assists, Carrol had three goals and three assists and Lukowich, a goal and three assists.

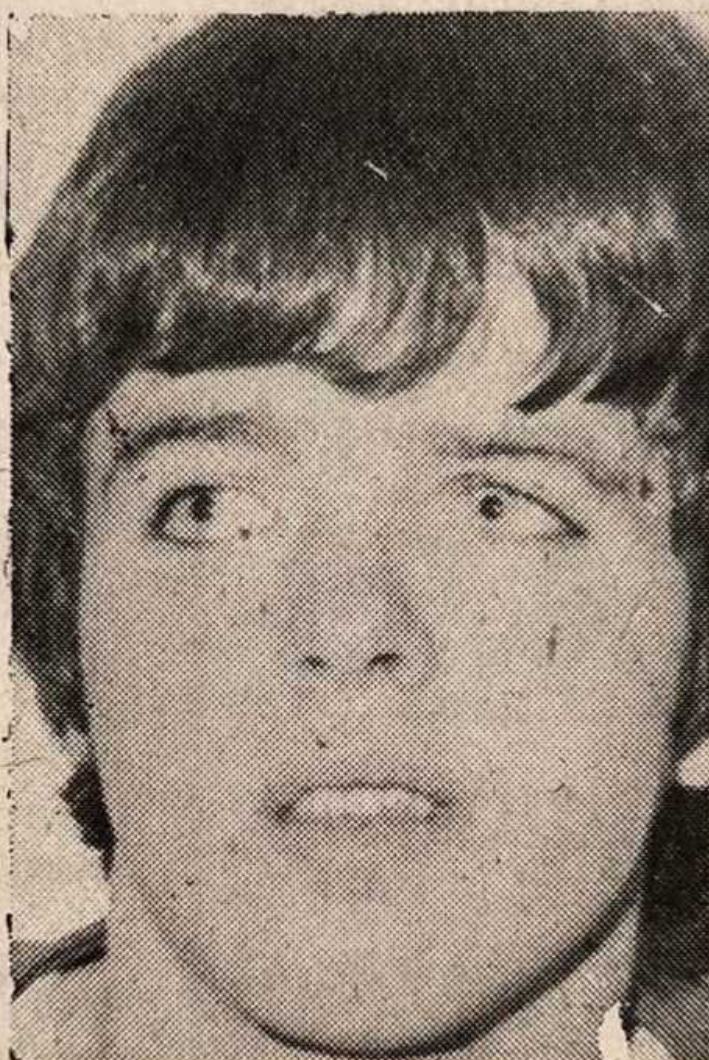
