Vernon Vikings defeated Maple Ridge Blazers 5-1 at the Civic Arena here during weekend B.C. Junior Hockey League action.

The win puts Vernon in first place, two points ahead of Kelowna Buckaroos in the BCJHL Interior division, although the Kelowna squad has a game in hand.

A scheduled match between Kelowna and Penticton Vees was postponed due to the Kelowna civic workers strike.

## Vernon, Kelowna tie 4-4

A goal by Darcy Anderson in the last minute of the third period gave Vernon a 4-4 tie with Kelowna in Okanagan Mainline Hockey League action here Saturday.

Anderson's goal was assisted by Earl Smith and Lester Creelman.

Vernon fell behind 3-1 in the first period, and was behind 3-2 at the end of the second period.

Doug Jeffers, assisted by Brett Stenberg and Roy Bernhardt, scored the first Vernon goal, while Rod Trentini scored the second when he netted a pass from Tim Kopp and Lance Vachon.

The third Vernon goal was scored by Kevin Vardin, assisted by team captain Alan Betton and Creekman.

The Vikings overcame a 1-0 deficit in the opening period for their comeback win over Maple Ridge.
