Vikings hoping to stretch lead

The red-hot Vernon Vikings travel to Penticton to take on the Vees in tonight's only scheduled B.C. Junior Hockey League game.

First-place Vikings have won 11 of their last 12 games after getting off to a mediocre start this season.

Penticton, currently in second spot, trails Vernon by eight points and Vikings have four games-in-hand.

Vernon Coach Joe Tennant attributes his team's success so far to a well-balanced unit, with no real stars.
