Semi-final series resumes tonight

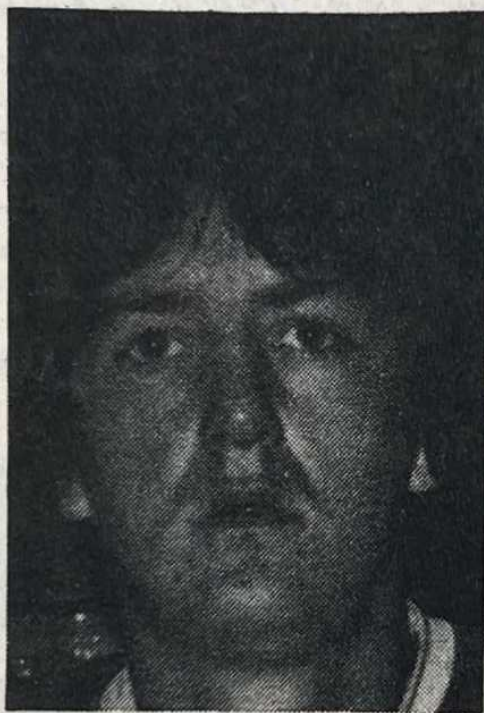
Vernon Vikings and Penticton Vees battle tonight in the Peach City in the second game of their eight-point B.C. Junior Hockey League semi-final series.

The teams battled to a 3-3 tie in the opening game.
