Couling accepts new post

KELOWNA, B.C. (CP) — Bryan Couling, president of the British Columbia Junior Hockey League, said Sunday that he will become the general manager of the league's Penticton Vees next month.

Couling said he doesn't know how his decision to join the Penticton club will affect his current position, but said meetings next month will decide his status.

Couling will take over from Dave Kampe, who has been acting general manager of the Vees since Nick Iannone was fired at the beginning of the season.

The Penticton team had poor attendance during most of the current season and Couling said there is a lot of work to be done in Penticton to promote the club.

Penticton is currently involved in the BCJHL final playoff series with Nanaimo, which leads the 10-point series 3-1. Next game is Tuesday.
