A group of students and teachers at Vernon Senior Secondary School are undertaking a huge one-week sports festival which will be called Chimo Days.

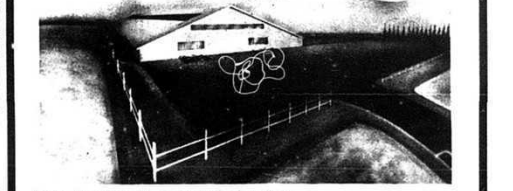
Panthers to host Westsyde
