

Tigers hammer Shamrocks 19-11

Vernon Lodge Tigers embarrassed Armstrong Shamrocks in Interior Lacrosse Association action before a capacity crowd on Friday night at the Armstrong Arena.

Tigers, with only six players and two goalies, thumped the full-strength Shamrocks 19-11. The victory moves Vernon six points ahead of second-place Kelowna Bruins as the club heads down the home stretch.

Tigers' assistant captain Dan Holte called the win probably the most satisfying in his long lacrosse career.

Holte said, "When we realized how short-handed we were, we thought we'd just try to keep it close by slowing the game down. I can't believe how well our guys played."

Several Vernon players left early Friday for Calgary, where the club will play an exhibition game tonight. The other team members were unavailable due to work and personal commitments.

Holte played probably the finest game of his life. The stocky forward scored five goals and added six assists. He was also a defensive stalwart.

His younger brother Gary scored four goals and had two assists while Terry Modell linked the red light five times.

Dale Rintoul scored three goals while Rick Horsley and Donny Bruce added singles.

For the Rocks, Ken McGregor scored three times while Jim Maundrell added a pair. Singles went to Bob Shannon, Bird Henderson, Jack Prokopets, Chuck Medhurst, Lance McGregor, and Kelly O'Brien.

Tigers led 5-0 after the first period and 11-7 after the second.

Holte said, "When we blanked them in the first 20 minutes, we still didn't believe we could win the game - we were beat. Holte (goaltender Zeechel) kept us in there in the second period and we realized we had a chance."

Armstrong netminder Dan Buchanan made 42 saves while Zeechel blocked 32 shots.

Tigers got lots of time to rest their weary legs while enjoying a p.w.e.r.-play ad. Guying a Rocks were assessed 14 of 18 minor penalties.

Vernon's opposition tonight will be Calgary Shamrocks. League play resumes on Tuesday night when the Tigers host Armstrong at 8:30 p.m.

Palmer defeated in women's final

VICTORIA (CP) - Youth won out over experience Friday when Paula Phillips, appearing in her first final, defeated 14-time finalist and eight-time champion Marilyn Palmer 5 and 3, in the 38-hole British Columbia women's golf championship final.

The 20-year-old University of British Columbia student, 1975 provincial junior champion and a member of the provincial women's team for the second successive year, showed great poise in keeping the pressure on her Vancouver Marine Drive clubmate.

Phillips trailed only once and was much the steadier after losing a two-hole lead late in the morning round and being forced to start the last round even.

"I just had too many bad shots and Paula was just too steady," Palmer said.

REGINA (CP) - Jim Eddy, who stood in line for a long time as a Saskatchewan Roughriders assistant before inheriting the head coaching job, is learning that patience is a virtue.

Eddy is attempting to retain the Western Football Conference title won by the Roughriders under John Payne last with a backfield riddled by injuries and departures.

Most of our problems are in the secondary," Eddy said in an interview. "We lost all our linemen, Ernie Richardson and all-conference Jim Marshall and they won't be easy to replace."

To compound his problems, Eddy also has veterans Ken McEachern, Ted Provost and Paul Williams out with injuries. Williams is expected to play for the season opener but McEachern will be out at least six weeks following an operation. Provost is out for an undetermined period with pulled leg muscles.

To replace the proven veterans, Eddy is experimenting with old-timers Lewis Cook and Barry Ardern and youngsters Emil Nielsen and Randy Graham.

HAVE NEW FACES

The offensive line won't be changed much, with Joe Miller, Sam Holden, Mike Dirk and Tom Galloway also coming back.
