

# Fulton advances in school soccer

Clarence Fulton Junior Secondary School captured the Vernon North-Vern High School Soccer League in dramatic fashion Saturday at MacDonald Park.

Fulton edged Kalamalka School, on penalty kicks, in one of the most exciting soccer games ever played in Vernon.

The teams battled through 90 minutes of scoreless play, two overtime periods, and 24 penalty shots before a winner was decided.

Fulton Coach Brian Tipler told the Daily News it was a great one to win, but a shame that one team had to lose.

Tipler said, "The boys played tremendously well as a team and I was pleased with the spirit of the game. The penalty kick competition was nervewracking."

**SIDE GOAL:**  
Fulton appeared to take the lead in overtime when a low shot beat Kalamalka goalie Dave Herman. However, after checking with young linesman, referee Keith Brooks called the goal offside. To Fulton's credit, they didn't argue the decision.

Tipler said, "I know he wasn't offside — he outran the defender for the ball. But arguing doesn't get you anywhere."

In the first set of five penalty shots, each team scored three. Again in the second set, each team was successful on three shots.

In sudden-death, Allan Gee scored for Kal and Murray Bennetto kept Fulton alive. On the second shot, Gord McKay had Fulton goalie John Connelly beat, but the ball trickled just inches wide. Then, Gary Casperman scored in that ended the season for Kal.

**PLAYS REVEALSTOKE:**  
Fulton now takes on Revelstoke in a home-and-home, two-game total-point series for the north zone championship. First game is today, at 4 p.m., at MacDonald Park. Second match will be Tuesday in Revelstoke.

Tipler said, "We don't know what to expect from Revelstoke. Their league isn't as strong as ours, but with a lot of players from the town's Italian community, they could have a good side."
