Montreal taking Detroit seriously

By GLENN COLE The Canadian Press Montreal Canadiens are more than a little bit worried about their best-of-seven National Hockey League quarter-final series against Detroit Red Wings which gets under way tonight. 'Detroit only has to think back to our last game,' said Montreal coach Scotty Bowman. 'They beat us 4-0 and that has to mean something in their minds when they play us.' 'We've got to remember that we've worked hard all year to finish first to get all the home game advantages and we have to remember how we did it.' 'The Red Wings have been working pretty hard to get where they are. I would have preferred to have played a team that had a playoff loss.' 'For three consecutive years, the Canadiens were matched against the winners of the west Smythe Division and had little trouble knocking off their opponents. Now they are up against a team which has to have some momentum after defeating Atlanta Flames in two straight games in the preliminary round. In the other quarter-final games, Toronto Maple Leafs visit New York Islanders, Boston Bruins play host to Chicago Black Hawks and Philadelphia Flyers entertain Buffalo Sabres, who are fresh from defeating New York Rangers 4-1 Saturday night in the deciding game of their best-of-three preliminary round. 'If you're a fan of the Canadiens finished 4-1 against Detroit this season with the Red Wings' 4-0

shout last Sunday ending a 23 game winless streak against Montreal. Montreal is healthy and rested after their week off. Left winger Bob Gainey, who has not played for 22 days because of a badly bruised shoulder, will be back tonight. Ken Dryden, who has played every Montreal playoff game while active with the club, is likely to make his 82nd playoff start while it is expected that Jimmy Rutherford, who blanked the Canadiens on the final day of the season, will likely start for Detroit. The Leafs, who used hustle and muscle to knock off Los Angeles Kings in two straight in the preliminaries, are going to have to do more of the same if they have a hope of upsetting the Islanders. 'It's not a question of trying to physically intimidate them because the Islanders are too big and strong for that,' said Toronto coach Roger Neilson. 'What we'll try to do is cut down their room to maneuver.' The Islanders, who took the

Patrick Division crown away from Philadelphia, took three of four games from the Leafs this season, beating Toronto 6-2 at Maple Leaf Gardens in their last meeting of the year March 22. The Bruins, who were upset by Chicago in the 1975 preliminary round, hope to be able to maintain their recent mastery of the Black Hawks. Boston took three of four games this season and outscored Chicago 15-4, but even of those goals came in a 7-0 triumph March 23. GRAMAME TO START Boston coach Don Cherry said he will start Ron Gramame, a refugee from the World Hockey Association's Houston Aeros, in goal against the Hawks while Iain Puffinbarger will go with Tony Esposito, hero of the 1975 upset. The Sabres were never much against the Flyers in Philadelphia until this season when they won once and tied once. The Sabres also took both games played in Buffalo, outscoring the Flyers 14-5.

MERRITT, B.C. (CP) - Merritt Centennials recorded two easy weekend wins over Calgary. Canucks - 4-1 Saturday and 6-0 Sunday to win their best-of-seven Centennial Cup quarter-final series 4-2. Pat Rabbitz scored two goals and goaltender Pat Murphy blocked 23 shots in Sunday's game before 1,147 fans. Bob Deschamps, Bud Langstrom, Dale Gault and Blake Steffen were the other Merritt marksmen. Bill Thachuk and Clint Malaruch combined for 44 saves in the Calgary net. Saturday, 1,800 fans watched Merritt take period leads of 3-0 and 4-0 on the way to victory. Calgary's lone goal came from Murray Brumway at 13:00 of the final period to ruin the shutout bid by Murphy. Deschamps and Eddie Beers led the scoring for Merritt with two goals each, while singles came from Billy Ferner, Robbitt, Ames and Gary Strika. Murphy stopped 19 shots in the Centennials' goal while Thachuk and Malaruch combined to stop 30 for Calgary.

Young skaters selected to play on Team Canada

TORONTO (CP) - Team Canada officials decided that the quickest way to a world hockey championship is achieved through the strong skating legs of young players. Of the 21 players selected for the championship, which begins in Prague April 26, two are over 30. Centre Jim Pelech, 32, of St. Louis Blues, and right wing Jean Pronovost, 32, of Pittsburgh Penguins. Hypaased because of the emphasis on youth are veterans of international play such as Phil Kessel, Carol Vadnais and Peter MacLean. Average age of the team, which left for Sweden Sunday night, is 24. 'We've got a good young skating club,' coach Harry Howell said. 'We emphasized youth because of the larger rinks in Europe. It's a different game over in Europe with the bigger ice surface. Over there it's a skate race. Our young legs

should be able to keep pace with the European teams. From Montreal, the winners of last year's team that finished fourth, agreed to play four games with the teams over in Europe, you have an excellent chance of beating them. The most penalized team in the World Hockey Association's regular season was a record 2,177 minutes despite numerous player suspensions and fines, the Bulls are continuing to rampage through the playoffs. 'Now the penalties are proving even more costly with nine power-play goals and one penalty-shot goal scored against them in two games. But still they promise more mayhem. 'I don't know if the penalties really did hurt the hockey game,' Bulls coach Glen Sonmor said after his team lost 3-2 to Winnipeg Jets Sunday night. 'We're trying to eliminate the silly type of penalty but we're not going to stop going after them physically. In fact, we'll intensify it as time goes by.' The Jets scored four power-play goals in their win Sunday night and took a 2-0 lead in the best-of-seven quarter-final series which continues in Birmingham on Wednesday. The Jets had scored five power-play goals and a penalty goal in Friday's 9-3 opening victory.
