

O'Keefe places 21st in junior tournament

Brian O'Keefe, of Vernon, slumped to an 80 on Friday to drop out of the top 20 at the British Columbia Junior Men's Golf Championship at the Seymour Golf Club in North Vancouver.

O'Keefe finished in 21st spot with a 72-hole total of 306, 20 strokes off the pace.

FRED COOPER
Fred Cooper of Seattle fired a three-under-par 69 Friday and came from two strokes off the pace to win the championship.

Couples 18, finished with a total of 286, two-under-par on the tough 6,350 yard layout.

Washington State golfers dominated the

tournament, as Brian Mogg of Tacoma finished second at 292 and John Bodenhammer, also of Tacoma, finished third at 294.

Couples, an honorable mention All-American as a freshman at Houston University, had three birdies and 15 pars during his round.

Mogg, who held the lead after the second and third rounds, blew to 77 on Friday.

Canadian boxers have a good shot

EDMONTON (CP) — Canada has never made many trips to the awards podium in boxing at the Commonwealth Games, winning only four medals in the last four Games.

But Doug McNeill, who manages the 10-member Canadian team for this year's Commonwealth Games, said he thinks Canada has a legitimate shot in every weight class, despite the fact four of his 10 fighters have no major international experience.

McNeill, a native of Calgary who coached the Canadian Armed Forces boxing team for six years, is banking on the strength and conditioning to pull Canadian boxers through the preliminaries into the medal final.

This week, the Canadian boxers conclude a grueling four-week training camp at Camp Wainwright, a Canadian Forces 200-kilometre east of Edmonton.

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — An eye injury received last season has forced veteran right winger Rosaire Paieiment of the World Hockey Association's Indianapolis Racers to retire from hockey.

Paieiment, 32, told the News he and his wife have purchased a motel in Fort Lauderdale, Fla.

Paieiment, who played in 483 consecutive WHA games before being sidelined by an eye injury received when he was punched by Edmonton's Dale Plunko on Oct. 25, began his professional career with Jersey Devils in the Eastern Hockey League in 1958.

He played with the National Hockey League's Philadelphia Flyers and Vancouver Canucks before joining Chicago Cougars of the WHA in 1972.

"I saw a specialist," Paieiment told the News. "He said I probably would have to play with a face mask if I decided to continue. But I'm always in a scuffle and all I'd need is another shot in that eye."

Lions looking at trio

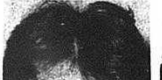
