Horse Talk Training & Handling with Don Fraser

This column is presented as an aid for non-professional horsemen who share common training problems. It serves as the medium for novice and experienced riders to seek advice and for the passing along of training tips that have worked for the author.

GUIDING Joe Williams of RR 2, Salmon Arm, recently wrote me a very nice letter, for which I thank him, to pass on his 64 years of knowledge in leading and tying related to the horse.

BRIDLE BUSTER Vernon girl writes: "I own a 12-year old Welsh pony gelding. I use him for a pleasure horse, but I have one big problem. When I tie him with his bridle on, he tends to rub it off or he pulls back and usually breaks it. I've tried different kinds of bridles but they don't help. I've owned him for five years and he just started this in the past two years. I've tried taking a soft cotton rope and making a slip knot and putting it around his halter rings, then tying it to a sturdy tree, but he then rubs his halter off."

First of all, bridles are for riding, halters are for tying! To use a bridle for the purpose of tying a horse is abuse! Not only is it expensive to replace the broken equipment, but the damage done to the horse's mouth, both bars and tongue, each time he pulls back is irreparable. Many horses have cut their tongues badly from just such practices.

When you tie your horse, use a sturdy nylon web halter of the tongue buckle variety. Adjust it snugly on his head. Behind this, buckle a soft leather or web nylon strap at least one and a half inches wide, again snugly. Secure the halter strap to the neck strap with stout nylon cord that will not break. The strap will hold the crown of the halter in place and he will not be able to rub it off. Then go ahead and use the body rope around his barrel as you have in the past.

Remember that once a horse has learned these bad habits, you will do little to affect a complete cure. It is a matter of prevention making the idea of trying it or doing it unattractive or impossible.

Horsley said the most satisfying thing for him has been, "To see our players attain the goals they set for themselves. To win three consecutive Canadian titles requires a tremendous amount of dedication."

Horsley, who was named the B.C. Lacrosse Association's Executive of the Year in 1976, said he has experienced few disappointments in lacrosse. He said, "Some people have disagreed with the way I have run the team - thinking I am too much of a disciplinarian. But, I don't have any regrets."
