

# Masks mandatory

Lacrosse has made the move, can hockey be far behind?

Last year, the Canadian Lacrosse Association made helmets for minor players mandatory. At the B.C. Lacrosse Association's annual convention last weekend in Victoria, a motion was passed making it mandatory for senior players to wear facemasks - effective next year.

Masks are already compulsory for minor hockey players and it probably won't be much longer until junior and senior players are forced to protect their faces.

One other interesting note from the B.C. convention - Vernon withdrew its application to host the 1979 provincial senior 'B' championships.

It seems the B.C.L.A. has decided that league, an' not a team or city, should host the championships. As a result, the Tigers could not host the tournament and they were not interested in co-operating with the Interior Lacrosse Association in staging the tourney.

# Yankees sign Tiant to multi-year contract

NEW YORK (AP) — For the next two years and another season beyond that if they decide they want him, New York Yankees will have Luis Tiant on their pitching staff.

After that, at the age of 40 or 41, the Cuban native will turn to more dignified pursuits as the Yankees' director of Latin American affairs.

"Sounds like a state department post, doesn't it?" said Paul George, the Boston lawyer who negotiated the

unique deal that delivered the veteran free agent to the Yankees on Monday after Boston Red Sox refused to offer him a contract of more than a year's duration.

George said Tiant signed with New York because of the long-term security the Yankees offered.

"It was a very attractive proposition," the lawyer said. New York was the only club to select negotiating rights to Tiant at the free agent re-

entry draft 10 days ago. That's because he will celebrate his 38th birthday at the end of the month and pitchers that age aren't in great demand, especially when they want multi-year contracts.

But the Yankees, who've been known to gamble in the freemarket marketplace, went after Tiant with an unusual offer that will keep him in their organization long after he's through pitching.

**GRABBED OPPORTUNITY**

"We saw an opportunity to grab a player who was known as anyone who has ever played this game," said Yankees president Al Rosen.

"It was a natural marriage."

Tiant was 15-5 with a 3.31 earned-run average for Boston last season, including a final game two-hit shutout over Toronto that won the Red Sox a tie with New York for the American League East crown and playoff berth.

And he thinks he can help the Yankees on the mound before he switches to the front office.

"As long as I can throw the ball to home plate and do my job, that's more important than my age," he said.

"Clayton Kerry's older than me and he won 21 games and the Cy Young Award (this year). His age didn't make any difference."

Tiant was considered washed up when released by Minnesota Twins following the 1970 season. But he signed with Boston and had three 20-victory seasons in eight years, last with the Red Sox and pushed his career victory total to 204.

The Montreal right winger is trying to become only the third player in NHL history to win four consecutive scoring titles. Gordie Howe accomplished the feat with

Detroit Red Wings from 1950-51 through 1953-54, and 20 years later Phil Esposito won four in a row with Boston Bruins from 1970-71 through 1973-74.

Lanny McDonald of Toronto, Wayne Babych and Bernie Federko of St. Louis Blues and Guy Chouinard of Atlanta are tied for fourth place with 22 points.

# Raiders trounce hapless Bengals

CINCINNATI (AP) — Oakland quarterback Ken Stabler, stung by media criticism, let his statistics do the talking Monday night.

After directing the Raiders to a 34-21 National Football League victory over Cincinnati Bengals with three touchdowns passes, the outspoken signalcaller replied simply and curtly: "Nothing personal, I just don't have any comment."

The victory lifted the Raiders into a first-place tie with Denver Broncos in the American Conference West. The Raiders and Broncos are tied each, while Cincinnati, suffering through its worst season, is 1-10.

Stabler, embittered because he has been the brunt of the attack surrounding the Raiders' four losses, was defended by team-mate Neal Colzie.

"He's gotten a lot of unnecessary publicity," said cornerback Colzie, whose 32-yard touchdown pass to Stabler recovered fumble sparked the Raiders to a 27-7 lead after three periods.

"We're hurting, but nobody mentions it," said Colzie.

**TURNOVERS COSTLY**

After Colzie's touchdown, Stabler capitalized on three other turnovers and also marched the Raiders 73 yards in the last two minutes of the first half for another touchdown.

Raiders coach John Madden agreed with Colzie's assessment of Stabler's rough start, which has included 20 interceptions — the most in the NFL this season.

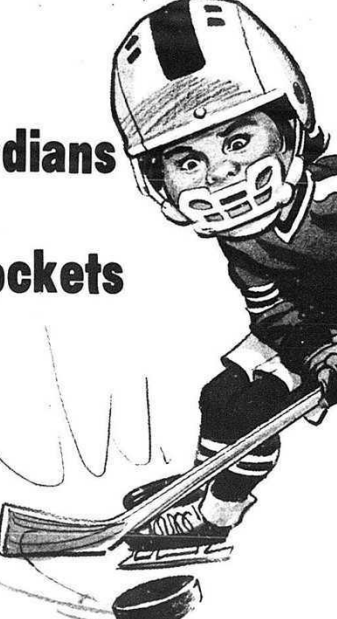
