

KLO coach surprised his team beat Panthers

The unheralded KLO Cougars overcame a 16-point deficit to edge Vernon Panthers 66-63 in an exhibition high school basketball action Wednesday night at Vernon Senior Secondary School.

For Panthers, it was their third loss in three pre-season games.

KLO Coach Glen Jollymour told the Daily News he was surprised his club won.

Jollymour said, "We have several players on the volleyball team that are going to the provincial championships next weekend. As a result, we've only had three practices and this was our first game."

BLOW LEAD

Cougars led 10-17 after the first quarter and Vernon held a 32-37 lead at half-time. In the third quarter, Panthers went to a full-court press and built up a 16-point lead. However,

Cougars came back with a press of their own to reel off 20 consecutive points and get back in the game.

Kelly Olson, Rob Fischer, and Greg DeLoche were the top scorers for Panthers with 16, 14 and 13 points respectively. Ironically, Olson and Fischer were the worst shooters on the floor. Olson missed 10 of 18, including his last five shots, while Fischer sunk only three of 12 from the floor.

Francis Brasm led Cougars with 15 points while Norm Born collected 14.

TURNOVERS HURT

Disappointed Vernon Coach Rick Irwig had little to say. He said, "We played a terrible game. Turnovers are killing us."

Panthers committed 34 turnovers, including eight by Olson and seven by guard Will Haak.

Vernon hit the road this morning for the coast where it will play the number one team in the province,

MEI Eagles, tonight. In two games this season, MEI has beat defending Okanagan champion Pentleton Lakers by 12 and seventh-ranked Delta Flyers by 20.

KAKOSKE HURT

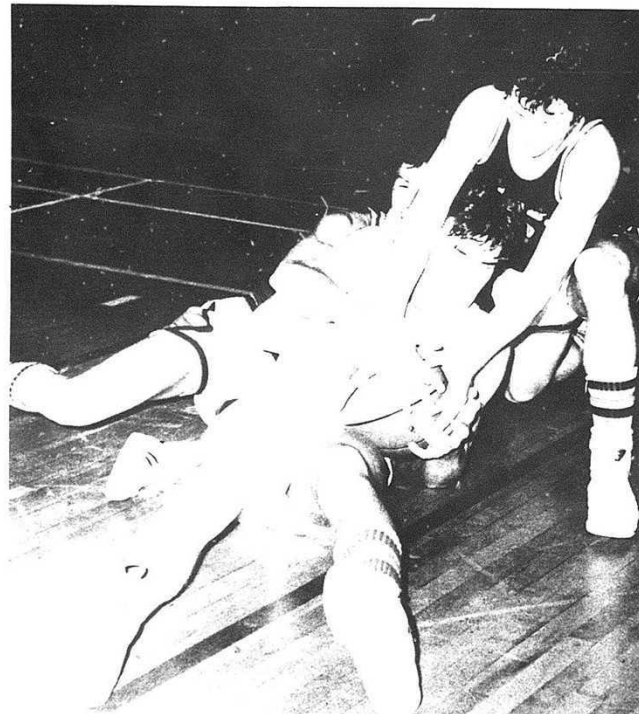
Forward Mike Kakoske, who missed Wednesday's game with an ankle injury, is expected to see some duty on the coast.
