Canadian rink still unbeaten

MOOSE JAW, Sask. (CP) — Canada has established itself as the rink to beat at the world juniors' curling championship. The Darren Fish rink of Edmonton knocked off the unbeaten Andrew McQuistin of Scotland 4-1 in Tuesday afternoon's fourth round. Afternoon's fourth round, the then-manhandled West German's Roland Jentsch 11-2 in eight ends at night. In the second round, the undefeated Canada's unbeaten streak of five games continued. "I love it," said Fish, who previously figured his rink's curling game when it had its collective back to the wall. Barring upsets, all that stands between Fish and a sweep of the round-robin section — good for a bye into the championship game Saturday — is the U.S. rink of Don Barcome. Fish is defending the world title from last year by Paul Gowell of Calgary, now over-aged. Canada plays the U.S. in the opening round of the competition today and then meets France in a tie-off tomorrow in the final two draws Thursday. Fish faces Italy's Massimo Elbers, who has only one win so far, and Germany's Ulf EPEST. Sweden, however, could be a spoiler as the Tony Eng rink swept the U.S. in an extra round Tuesday, dropping the Americans to a 2-2 record. The loss may have cost the U.S. team for its meeting with
