AUDIENCE LARGEST EVER
NEW YORK (AP)—The largest audience in the history of World Series television, estimated at 80 million people, watched ABC's coverage of the final baseball game of the 1979 series between Pittsburgh Pirates and Baltimore Orioles, say network estimates based on Nielsen ratings. That made it the fourth most watched sports program of all time, behind three football Super Bowls.
