



# Cougars post win against Packers

Vernon Sport Cougars levelled the Kelowna and Revelstoke Selkirk squeaked by Salmon Arm 8-5 in a close one Friday, in North Okanagan Hockey League action.

Scoring for the Cougars-Packers matchup, played in Vernon, showed early effort by the Cougars, who opened the scoring at 87 seconds on a goal by Dave Caldwell, assisted by Wayne Dye. Four minutes later, the Cougars stretched their lead to two goals on an effort by Wayne Dye, assisted by Paul Gault and Terry Love. Packers came back with their only goal of the period at the 16:57 minute mark, when Brad Owens scored. The Cougars, in the last minute of the period, got goals 20 seconds apart from Gault and Glenn Lockhart.

In the third period, Cougars struck for five unanswered goals, starting at 5:50 on a shot from Terry Love. Subsequent goals came from Grant Sidick, Vern Dye and two from Fred Persepkin, to round out the scoring.

# Eye smiling these days

You'll have to excuse Vern Dye if he never stops smiling these days. Vern still hasn't got over the shock of operating a hockey team last season and not having to fork over any dollars to pay the bills.

After years of subsidizing the local junior hockey team (along with other owners), Dye got out of the junior rat race two years ago. Because hockey is something Vern can't get out of his blood, he got involved with an intermediate club last season - partner and general manager of Vernon Cougars.

The easiest way to tell the difference between junior and intermediate hockey is to look at operating budgets. A junior team will spend in excess of \$70,000 per season, while an intermediate club could buy team jackets and still get by on \$5,000.

Those lower expenses suited Vern fine - and the brand of hockey that intermediates play seemed to interest local hockey fans. Vernon Cougars enjoyed a good 1978-79 season. The team won the NOHL title and didn't lose a single game.

This year, things look even better for the Cougars. Vernon has an excellent hockey

team that is an odds-on favorite to repeat as NOHL champions.

Next weekend, Cougars will host an eight-team tournament that offers \$4000 in prize money. Some of the top intermediate clubs in Western Canada will be on hand.

And Cougars plan to enter the Coy Cup competition this year, after the NOHL playoffs conclude. Having a team in the Coy Cup will give not only Vernon, but the entire NOHL, credibility.

**WATCH FRIENDS**

Dye said, "People seem to identify more with intermediate hockey. They'll come out to watch their friends, or guys they work with play hockey. With the juniors it's a hard for people to get to know them."

"Don't get me wrong, it was a shocker to see junior hockey die here. But, there is no way the junior teams can keep operating with those huge budgets."

The NOHL is one of the oldest hockey leagues in Canada. And the only way the league will ever get in trouble is if the budgets start rising and the clubs get in financial trouble.

Chances of that are slim because there are men like Vern Dye around to remind everyone what happened to junior hockey.

# Taft Hatchery helps restock Shuswap chain

The trout hatchery at Taft, located between the time and efforts donated: Les Lawson, Ed Gibson, Fay and Dave Watts, K. Donations to Taft Hatchery have been received from 348 individuals totaling \$1,458 including: Armstrong Fish and Game Club \$50, Blue Star, Restaurant \$10, Buena Vista Restaurant \$50, Columbia Shuswap Regional District \$500, Copper Island Resort \$50, CUPF \$50, Armstrong \$100, Dave Lantson \$25, Lazy Daze Resort and Marina \$100, Paul Neilson \$50, Twin Anchors Marina \$50, and Waterloo House \$25.

With a successful season completed and release of the fingerlings, the promised \$2,000 grant will be requested from the provincial government. A meeting is being arranged with the Honorable Rate Man to request a permit and 1,000,000 eggs for next year. Considerable hatchery improvement is planned, including a concrete rearing pond and road improvement to accommodate visitors.

Birds has been in charge of the hatchery all summer and deserves great credit for his volunteer effort. Orlis will also retain about 10,000 trout in the hatchery ponds and feed them all winter.

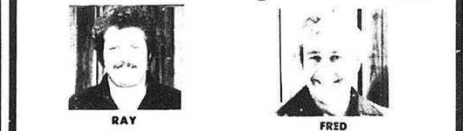
