

Yes vote is needed



Lumby area voters have an important decision to make on Nov. 17.

They are being asked to approve a new multi-use recreation complex - curling club for the Village of Lumby.

The bottom line is that the cost to the average residential unit in the White Valley Parks and Recreation District would be \$8-10 per year over a 20-year period.

When you consider the cost of a ticket to a Vancouver Canucks hockey game or a B.C. Lions football game goes from \$8 to \$12, the expense is minimal.

The facility, if approved, would be constructed on land presently owned by the village, behind the Lumby Arena.

The major reason for the proposal is that the existing curling club is in dire need of repairs which have been estimated at about \$200,000. Those renovations would not provide for any future expansion or use for non-curling activities.

AN ASSET

The new facility would be a tremendous asset to the entire White Valley area. It would provide a building that could serve the community for many purposes.

During the non-ice season, the facility would be operated by the recreation department and would be available to local groups at a minimal cost. Activities such as dances, floor hockey, roller skating, exhibition shows, banquets, and club meetings could be held in the new building.

During the curling season, the operation and maintenance would totally be the responsibility of the local curling group. The Lumby and District Curling Club has agreed to pay \$15,000 rental per year for a 20-year period to defray the capital debt charges.

In total, the estimated cost of the structure, including escalating inflation factors, is \$354,000; which could be considerably reduced through the tendering process and the aid of volunteers. Barriere recently built a similar facility for \$370,000.

In addition, application for a Recreation Facilities Assistance Grant will be made and should be approved. That would reduce the cost by one-third. Funds from both provincial and federal lotteries may also be available.

Two years ago, Greater Vernon narrowly approved a recreation referendum which is allowing this city's facilities to catch up with the needs of the community.

The new facilities such as the Recreation Complex arena, and gym, lacrosse box at Greendale Park, softball fields at Kin Track, and picnic area at Kin Beach have provided an opportunity for thousands of people to participate in activities.

The new facility in Lumby could perform a similar duty for that area and give the community a complex to be proud of.

On Nov. 17, think of the future and vote yes.

The locals came out flying and led 6-2 after one period. Vernon was in front 3-3 after 40 minutes.

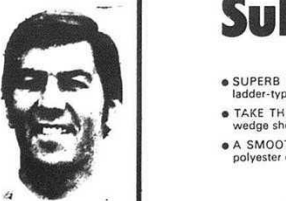
