**DYE IS PRESIDENT**  
**Vernon rejoins junior A league**

Vernon will have a team in the British Columbia Junior Hockey League for the 1980-81 season.  
At the annual BCJHL meeting this week, the league members voted to readmit Vernon after a one year leave of absence. Vern Dye and Hank Aarsen represented a group of businessmen, that will operate the local club, at the meeting.  
**NAMED PRESIDENT**  
Dye, who was affiliated with the Vernon Junior club for 10 years, was elected as the league's new president. Dye is the league's fourth president in the last three years. He replaced Al Cartwright, of Swinton, who took the post last season.  
Duncan was admitted to league's Coast Division while Sealingham Blazers were granted a one year leave of absence.

Two other important motions were approved at the meeting. For the first time, there will be no interlocking games between the Coast and Interior Divisions next season. In past years, each club had made one or two extended road trips.  
Other members of the Interior Division are Penitentiary, Kelowna, Revelstoke, and Merritt.

Dye told the Daily News the interlocking games had to be eliminated to reduce costs. "With the high cost of travel and hotels, we had to cut out the coast trips," he said.  
The Vernon team, currently without a name, will play its home games in the Civic Arena. League play is scheduled to get under way in early October.
