## Soccer teams advance to final

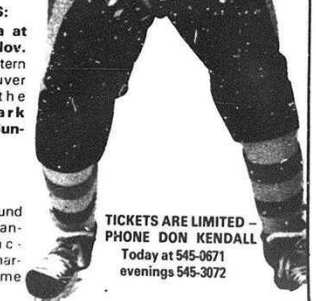
