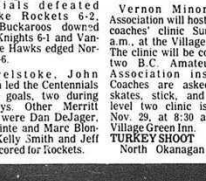
In B.C.JHL action Friday, Tony St. Denis scored five goals and had two assists as Cowichan Valley Capitals hammered Chilliwack 10-1.
