Top teams post wins

Kelowna Packers and Vernon Cougars continued their domination of the North Okanagan Hockey League over the weekend.

Packers stretched their winning streak to 10 games Saturday with a 1-0 victory over Grindrod Elks.

Cougars kept pace with Kelowna by blasting Salmon Arm Aces 10-2 on Saturday.

In other weekend action, Grindrod dumped Salmon Arm 6-2. Rutland Molsons doubled Revelstoke Sekiaks 6-3, and Selkirk beat Molsons 7-2.

With more than one-third of the season completed, Packers hold a two-point edge on the

defending champions. Brad Owens led Kelowna past Grindrod with three goals while Fred Parent, Gord Bowman, and Larry Keating added two apiece.

In Salmon Arm, Terry Lowe led the Vernon onslaught with four goals and two assists while Dave Caldwell and John Box each scored twice. Singles went to Les Salo and Wayne Dye.

Caldow also had two assists. Tom Yates and Tom Drabren replied for the lovely Aces. Salmon Arm has not won in 13 outings this season.

First-place will be on the line Friday when Packers host Cougars, at 8 p.m.

Lakers move closer to pack

Vernon Lakers are still firmly entrenched in the B.C. Junior Hockey League Interior Division cellar. However, they are moving closer to the pack.

Vernon posted its third victory, in the last five games, with a 6-3 win over Kelowna Buckaroos Saturday night at the Civic Arena. It was Lakers' first triumph, in six meetings, with the speedy Bucks this season.

Vernon, with 10 points, is 22

points back of first-place Revelstoke Rockets, but only 10 back of fourth-place Merritt Centennials.

Dave Fish led Lakers with two goals while Richie Odierne, Darcy Anderson, Darryl James, and Kevin Poirier added one apiece.

LEADTEAM
Fish, known throughout his minor league career for digging, and aggressive play, he became a prolific sniper. He leads Lakers in scoring with 13 goals.

For the Buc., Paul Houck, Gary Leask, and Mike Rousseau scored one each. The teams were tied 1-1 at the end of the first period and Lakers held a 3-2 edge after 40 minutes. Midway through the third, Fish got his second goal of the night on a powerplay and Poirier added an insurance

Thirty-two teams competed for more than \$28,000 in the four-day event.

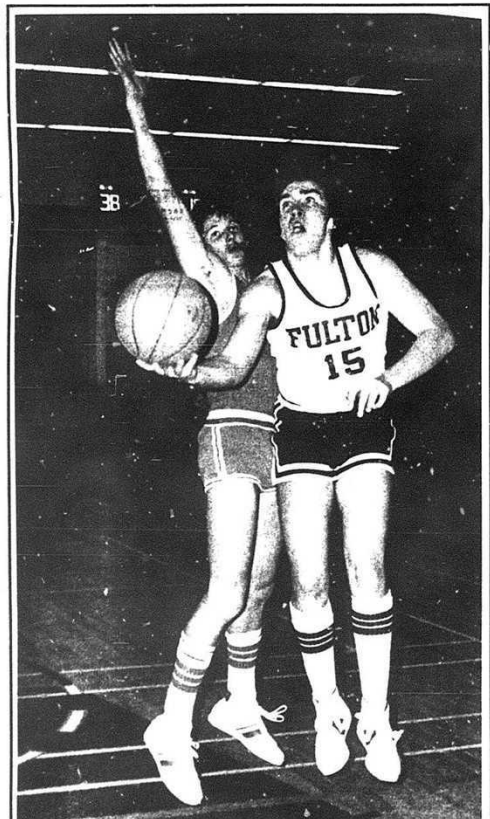
Folk counted two in the 10th end, with the hammer, to cap-
