EQUIPMENT CHECK

Chances are, the last time you went skiing, the snow was warm and slushy; you walked through the muddy parking lot in your ski boots; your spouse skied through, and everyone bounced home.

Add a little dog hair and lawn clippings over the summer, and your equipment needs a clean up before you start out this year.

Get the old wax off with a solvent (lacquer thinner). It's good for grease spots on the top surface as well as bindings and boots. Finish off the ski top surface and the boots with ski and tan. Pull the bladders out of the boots to air out.

By this time, you have had a good look at your equipment. Problems? Have your bindings checked at a shop and ask about any other difficulties you may have discovered.

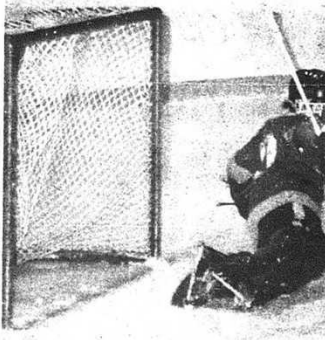
