## RELEASE SYSTEMS

It's like being in a big semi-trailer truck on a steep grade, you'd like to be able to get out if you have to, but you'd be pretty annoyed if the brakes seized up.

You can have confidence in most bindings sold today; to release you in a bad fall, but hold you in when you've made a minor miscalculation, provided you bought a product appropriate to both your weight and ski ability.

The correct weight setting is easily ascertained by reading the chart supplied by the manufacturer. The boot to binding adjustments should be made by a certified ski mechanic.

For storage, the bindings should be covered and their springs backed off. If in doubt, get out; it's time for a change.
