D downhill skiers, cross-country skiers, and snowmobilers enjoy their activities side-by-side. Through the efforts of the park's staff and governing bodies for the three sports, there have been few conflicts.

However, there are a few people who are abusing the facilities provided for their enjoyment.

OFF LIMITS

It has come to our attention that some snowmobilers are disobeying boundary signs and are venturing into parts of the park reserved for skiers.

Vernon Snowmobile Association Vice-president George Copeland said his club is aware of the problem and certainly does not condone wandering snowmobiling.

Copeland said, "One aim of our association is to promote safe and responsible snowmobiling."

"On both sides of the snowmobile recreation area, there are trails for skiers and downhill skiers. Designated snowmobile areas are clearly marked."

Club members are aware of the boundaries and often patrol the mountain looking for offenders.

SIGNS DESTROYED

"Recently, warning signs were destroyed by two people who took a snowmobile in a restricted area," Copeland said. "Some association members witnessed this incident, reported it to the proper authorities, and legal action is being considered at this time."

Silver Star Ski Area spokesman Mike Duggan said luckily there have been no accidents this season involving snowmobilers and skiers.

"There have been three occasions when we've notified park officials about snowmobilers being out of terrain," Duggan said, "but we haven't had any major problems."

Copeland issued a stern warning to people who violate the rules.

"Our association is responsible for the proper conduct of snowmobilers on Silver Star," he said. "We will continue to provide anyone who snowmobiles in an irresponsible manner."

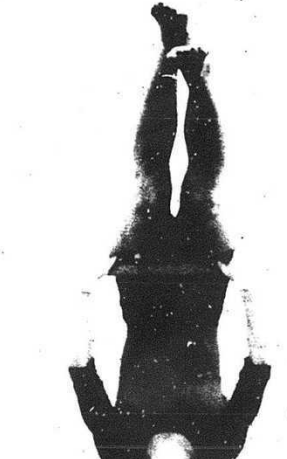

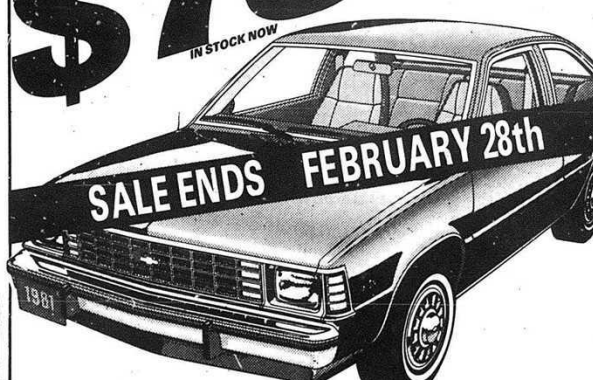
