Kamloops Oilers, of the Western Hockey League, have scheduled a press conference Tuesday when General Manager Harvey Roy is expected to announce the team's first affiliate.

Vernon Lakers and Merritt Centennials, both of the B.C. Junior Hockey League, are the leading contenders.

Lakers' President Al Thomas said earlier this week he was confident his club would be chosen by Oilers, but declined comment on whether a decision had been reached.

Will teams usually place eight-to-10 of their top prospects with a tier two affiliate.

Meanwhile, about 40 players remain in Vernon's training camp, which got under way earlier this week.
