

Cougars extend winning streak

Vernon Cougars stretched their winning streak to six games with a 10-2 win over Kelowna Packers in North Okanagan Hockey League action Sunday, at the Civic Arena.

On Saturday, in Oliver, Cougars doubled the Bigmen's 6-3.

BEST GAME
"It was our best game of the season... by far," Cougars' Director Ring Cam said after Sunday's victory. "Charlie (Brishkham), held in there the first 10 minutes, then we started playing hockey." Ron Bigler gave Packers a 1-0 lead and only some great stops by Brishkham prevented Kelowna from opening a three or four goal lead.

Cougars return to the ice next Saturday, in Rutland, against the Moisons.

Lakers hammer Rockets

Five players scored two goals each to lead Vernon Lakers to a 14-3 victory over visiting Revelstoke Rockets in B.C. Junior Hockey League action Sunday before 250 fans.

It was the most goals scored by Vernon, in a single game, since the 1975-76 season when the club broke five league records.

On Sunday, Lakers dominated every aspect of the game. Their tenacious forechecking pinned Rockets in the end of the rink.

And on the occasions when Revelstoke was able to move the puck up the ice, Vernon played sound positional hockey in the defensive zone.

TWO EACH
Rob Kossan, Jeff Armitage, Wayne Bodnaruk, Darcy Lepine, and Dean Hiscard led the rout with two goals each.

Dale Reimer, Rickie Odoime, Brian Heiler, and Roy Chase added singles.

Kossan scored his third goal midway through the third period, when he deflected a point shot by Lepine. However, the goal was credited to Lepine and officials would not change the call.

Derek Waters, Armitage, and Kossan each collected three assists.

Vern Cota, Wade Waters, and Terry Grams countered for Revelstoke.

Despite the offensive outburst, Vernon Coach Gord MacBeth said defence was the key for his club.

"We've been working on checking in practice," he said, "and it is paying off. You could see it the other night (Friday) against Penticton... we lost, but we played well defensively."

Kossan put Lakers in front at 3:27, of the first period. Cota tied the game at 5:28, but before the period ended, Vernon was in front 3-1. Lakers increased that margin to 7-2 after 40 minutes.

Roy Drobochuk and Karl Landry combined to block 39

shots for Rockets while Shawn Oswald made 23 saves for the Rockets.

Veteran netminder Randy Kirby, who surrendered nine goals Saturday in a loss to Kelowna, did not dress for Revelstoke.

The teams split eight minor penalties.

"Our guys were really up for it," MacBeth said. "Mental preparation is very important in junior hockey and we couldn't have been more ready. We were on a three-game losing skid and wanted to map out the

Vernon is scheduled to meet the last-place Centennials, Tuesday, in Merritt. Next Sunday, Lakers host Kelowna Packers in a game MacBeth feels could be pivotal for his team.

"If we win our next two games, we're within striking distance of the Bucks (who are in second-place)," MacBeth said. "If we lose, we'll drop way behind Kelowna."
