

Sabres provide Bowman with victory over Sabres

It wasn't by much, but a third-period goal by Lindy Ruff gave Buffalo Sabres a 3-2 final edge over Montreal Canadiens and their thrashing on a 3-4 win Sunday to earn a berth in the first round of the NHL playoffs. Scotty Bowman's first National Hockey League victory since returning to the bench.

Smith swims in final meet

BHANTFORD, Ont. (CP) — Graham Smith was sitting in the stands at the Brant Aquatic Club when he learned of the Canadian Winter National and course swimming championships Saturday night. He was watching the other competitors celebrate — his career at an end.

Smith, who won six gold medals for Canada in the 1978 Commonwealth Games, and set world records in the 200-metre individual medley race in 1977 and 200-metre swim his final competitive race.

"Yeah, it's hard to leave," Smith said quietly. "It's hard to leave."

He had wanted to retire two years ago, but a support of the 1980 Summer Olympics made him stay a while longer. Now, 25 years old, he wants to give way to the younger crop of breaststroke specialists.

Smith presented the medals for the 200-metre breaststroke race, including the gold medal to Victor Davis, 18, of the Region of Waterloo swim club.

FIFTH GOLD

Smith won his fifth gold medal of the meet for Davis and gave him the individual championship 100-metre butterfly. He also won the 100-metre breaststroke, 200-metre butterfly, 200-metre individual medley and 200-metre medley relay.

Davis won the 200-metre breaststroke race Saturday night in two minutes, 18.28 seconds, well off the fastest of 1:11.34.

The summer then went out and gave him the lead in the relay, which he teammates led for the victory, good enough to win the men's team championship.

Smith, 20, of the Oshawa (Ont.) Aquatic Club, won the women's 200-metre freestyle sprint in 23.55, while Louis St-Laurent, 22, of the Quebec Selects club, won the men's 100-metre freestyle sprint in 23.55.

A surprise in the women's sprint final was the age-16 individual of Jane Kerr and Andrea Schlegel.

Kerr, with the Etobicoke (Ont.) swim club, is only 13 years old, while Schlegel, with the North York (Ont.) swim club, is 14. Schlegel placed fifth and Kerr fourth.

Canadian team adjusts to ice

GENEVA (CP) — It was a familiar problem for Canada — trying to adjust to ice conditions in European arenas.

Swedish junior quartet defeats Thompson rink

Niklas Jarund, second Henrik Holmberg and lead Anders Svensson — were allowed to stick to their game plan by scoring two in the first end and adding a steal in the second.

The victory for Sweden was only its second at the world junior after winning the inaugural event at Toronto in 1975. It was also the first time a rink had gone unbeaten in both round-robin and championship play.

"They are very good on the draw game, I could see that Thursday and again Friday," he said. "That is why we tried to keep off their corner guards and keep the front of the house clear so they didn't draw."

"Everytime they got the chance, they got very fine draws."

FINISH THE ANSWER

But the Swedes obviously had the answer for Canada's draw game, especially after Jarund lost a quick lead and being allowed to play the draw-out strategy they had worked on earlier.

If one country goes through the round-robin tournament with an undefeated record, then only the second- and third-place rinks will advance to the semifinals.

Jones, a 22-year-old secretary who won the recent Canadian championship by defeating Bob Rose of Winnipeg in the final game at Regina, stole single points in each of the third, fourth, eighth, ninth and 10th points in the last end to win.

MISSA TAKEOUT

With the score tied 5-5 in the ninth end, the Italians appeared to have a chance to score at least four points. But the Italian skip missed a open takeout and Jones stole a point.

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
