NEW YORK (AP) — New York Yankees were humming a familiar tune when they started the start tonight of manager Joe Michael's second time around.

"There's always been a big turnover here," said relief pitcher Tom Seaver Sunday. "We've come to expect it."

Michael's return to pinstripes as the Angels' Angels invaded New York City for a game on Monday was rained out, postponing Michael's on-field debut.

"I think it will be better this time," said Michael, fired Sept. 6, 1981, after a 10-10 split weeks with Yankees' owner George Steinbrenner threatened to fire him. Michael learned some things in the past year.

"I know it will be rough working for George," he said. "But I have to see what I can do with the Yankees. I know that winning will make it a lot easier."

After rehiring of Michael, who has been serving as a Yankee

out," was announced Sunday night. He replaced Lemon, who ad replaced Michael last season. "I was shocked to wake over Michael's scouting error," said manager.

Frederickson fired Lemon on 14 games into the season and with the Yankees won-lose record at 1-1.

Michael, 42, inherits a club with several morale problems. Several players have said the Yankees are "not a good team" and "not a good organization" and an erratic starting pitcher.

"I'm tried to keep everybody happy," said catcher Rick Cerone. "It was chaotic, but I have to cut blaming others."

"We played terrible in the spring and got off to a bad start. And it also seems to come down to the manager."

Two of the most dissatisfied players are outfielders Fred Lennie and Bucky Dent. Collins, an outfielder who was supposed to get a new contract as a first baseman, has seen little action. Dent, an all-star shortstop, has been a platoon player since September.
