

HULL SCORES WINNER

Knights lead division

Brett Hull's goal at 1:54 of the third period proved to be the winner as Penticton Knights defeated Vernon Lakers 6-4, in Penticton Saturday night.

After winning an easy 11-4 decision over Merritt Centennials, Sunday night, Knights have moved into first place in the BCJHL Interior Division, one point ahead of Vernon and two points ahead of Kelowna Buckaroos.

Glen Doucette, Ken Fenton, Rob Kossan and Tod Ewen replied for the Lakers.

Sunday night, Kelowna dropped a 6-2 decision in New Westminster to remain in third place.

Lakers, who were idle Sunday, have one game-in-hand on the Knights. Vernon has five games

remaining, including a pair of games on the Coast against Richmond and Burnaby while at home to Langley, New Westminster, and Kelowna.

In another BCJHL game Sunday, Shuswap Totems downed Cowichan Valley 7-2. On Saturday, Revelstoke edged Cowichan 5-4, Kelowna doubled Abbotsford 4-2, and Shuswap nipped Merritt 3-2.
