

Langley Eagles are still BCJHL's only unbeaten team

Langley Eagles continued their domination of the B.C. Junior Hockey League Friday when they trounced Burnaby Bluehawks 13-3 and recorded their 11th straight win.

Langley, the only undefeated team in the BCJHL, had period leads of 4-1 and 7-2.

In other league action Friday, Shuswap Totems dealt Penticton Knights their first loss of the season with a 6-4 win and Richmond Sockeyes downed Cowichan Valley Capitals 6-3.

In Langley, Paul Lelievre had three goals for the winning Eagles, while Oscar Pozzolo, Harvey Biluk, Earl Graham and Rod Ware each scored twice, and singles came from Dean Rutledge and Don Cumiskey.

Dave Nonis, Dave Sitch and Pat Allardyce replied for Burnaby, whose record stands at 3-6.

Glen Pencer and Glen Stone combined to make 22 saves for Langley, while Burnaby netminders Terry

Burton and Paul Anaka turned aside 25.

Langley took 75 minutes in penalties, while Burnaby was assessed 69.

KNIGHTS WIN

In Penticton, Shuswap Totems scored three unanswered goals in the first period to defeat the hometown Knights.

Penticton has a 11-1 record while the win was only Shuswap's second in 13 games.

The Totems, who were ahead 4-1 by the end of the second, were led by Albert Anthony and Verne Williams with two goals apiece while Rob Klenk and Brian Powell added singles.

Ed Cristofoli and Ken McGillivray had two-goal performances for Penticton.

The teams racked up 127 minutes in penalties, nine game misconducts and one double game misconduct as a result of a fight that broke out just after the first

period ended, when Shuswap goalie Ralph Bechtold speared Penticton's Rey Fontaine.

In Duncan, Eric Catchpole scored three goals to lead Richmond to its defeat of the Capitals, who are in the bottom of the league's Coastal Division.

Richmond was ahead 1-0 at the end of the first and 3-2 by the end of the second.

Jeff James scored twice — both on power plays — for Richmond while David Holmes rounded out the scoring with a single.

Scoring for Cowichan were James McKee, Brian Sweeny and Chad Walker.

Cowichan netminder Norm Wright stopped 49 shots while Dean Shaw made 45 saves for Richmond.

The next BCJHL action is tonight when Revelstoke is at Summerland, Vernon travels to Shuswap, Richmond visits Nanaimo and Burnaby is in Abbotsford.
