

Coach not happy despite easy win

Nanaimo Clippers took an easy 6-2 home-ice win from Cowichan Capitals Tuesday night but Clippers' coach Wayne Bianchin isn't giving his players a chance to rest on their laurels.

"We played not too bad, considering we had only two games in two weeks," the coach said. "We weren't entirely consistent throughout the game. I'm still experimenting with out lines, and as a

result once in a while we have some problems."

Kerry Coroy and Darrel Pederson each scored twice for the Clippers who lead 1-0 after the first period and 4-2 after the second.

Nanaimo goalie Ken Trousdell made 29 saves, getting beaten by Dave Milan and Tom Kurucz. Ed Jones stopped 34 shots on the Cowichan goal.

In Richmond, it was Brooke Odenvald's night. The Sockeyes hotshot

scored four goals and two assists en route to a 10-5 win over Burnaby Bluehawks.

Teammate Peter McCormick added a pair of goals while David Apps, Rick Dietrich, Ron Duval, Tony Horachek and Ron Popoff replied.

Dean Shaw made 21 saves in Richmond net. Burnaby's Paul Anaka made 42 saves before being replaced by Terry Burton who stopped six shots.
