Penticton Knights behind eight ball

PENTICTON, B.C. (CP) — Goalie Scott Bradley was unbeatable in the third period as Langley Eagles edged Penticton Knights 5-4 Friday night to take a 3-0 lead in their best-of-seven B.C. Junior Hockey League championship series.

The teams meet here again tonight.

Langley led 3-2 at the end of the first period, but Tim Comeau scored his second goal of the game with six minutes left in the second period to pull Penticton into a 4-4 tie.

Don Cumiskey scored the winning goal

for Langley with six minutes left in the game, while Bradley kept the Knights at bay, stopping 16 shots in the final period. Bradley finished the night with 33 saves.

Ian Clark and Mike Jeffrey shared the Penticton goaltending chores, stopping 21 shots. Clark left the game with a deep scalp cut suffered when he was struck on the head by a slapshot at 8:32 of the first period.

Pat Barnes scored twice for Langley, while Neil Reimer and Joe West added singles.

Greg Cyr had the other Penticton goals.
