

Also, to the many treasured volunteers and host families, a sincere thank you for the hundreds of hours you spend to help the BCJHL be the great league that it is today.



Danny Shermerhorn

A 19 year old can-do-it-all kind of forward. Extremely versatile gunner who can get the job done in his own zone. Doesn't shy away from physical contact yet takes very few penalties. Excellent puckhandler and very slick around the net. This Calgary boy has college scouts after him and will likely have his pick of U.S. colleges to attend next year.

DEFENCE

Todd Kelman

It's hard to believe this lad is only 17 years old when you see him out on the ice. Extremely poised for a kid coming

out of midget hockey in Calgary, Kelman is as good a student as he is a hockey player. Good size and smooth on the blades ar two of the reasons Central Scouting of the NHL is monitoring his progress. Another Laker who wants to use hockey to get an education, Kelman has already attracted plenty of attention from the scouts.


MVP

A Winning Tradition!!



1991-92 Vernon Lakers: Western Canadian Champions

THE YEAR IS 1970.

William Halina is the city's mayor and Odie Lowe is head coach of the Vernon Essos junior hockey club.

Lowe and general manager Vern Dye guided Vernon to their first B.C. Junior Hockey League championship, looking to Quesnel and Cranbrook for the bulk of their talent.

Toss in starry locals like Lawrence Quechuk, Wayne Dye and Bob Mayer (captain) and the Essos had built a winner. A YOUNG RINK RAT BY THE name of Terry Lowe grew up following his father Odie to Civic Arena. The extra ice time obviously paid off as Terry won the BCJHL scoring title with the 1978-79 Vernon Canadians.

Terry's team-record 154 points was broken last year by Scott Longstaff, who won the league scoring title with 160 points for the Vernon Lakers.

Vernon's junior A franchise has featured a few different monikers (Vikings the other nickname) since entering the BCJHL in the 1961-62 campaign.

The Canadians, Kamloops Rockets, Kelowna Buckaroos and Penticton Vees all joined the Okanagan Junior Hockey league when the Okanagan Senior League folded.

Kamloops won the league title and then defeated the Trail Smoke Eaters for the first Mowat Cup (provincial championship).

The Okanagan Junior League was re-named the B.C. Junior Hockey League in 1967-68 when the New Westminster Royals and Victoria Cougars were admitted.

The Chilliwack Bruins, with 15year-old sensation Ron Greschner, entered the BCJHL in 1970-71 and two divisions were formed for the first time.

That same season, Eddie Johnstone of the Vernon Essos placed fifth in league scoring (45-49-94).

Johnstone of course went on to spend 10 years in the NHL and upon retirement, became the most successful coach in Vernon junior A hockey history.

Ernie Gare was head coach when the Lakers won the BCJHL title in '87-88, their first year with Mel Lis as owner-GM.

Leading the Lakers that season was Dallas Drake (39-85-124), who signed a lucrative (\$275,000) contract with the Detroit Red Wings this season.

Vernon appeared in their first of four straight Centennial cup (national) tournaments in '88-89 with Johnstone as an assistant to Gare.

The Lakers, after winning the Mowat and Abbott (Western Canada) Cups, finished last in the Centennial Cup in Summerside, P.E.I. Jason Marshall (now with St. Louis Blues' IHL affiliate) and Bill Lindsay (playing for Quebec Nordiques) were the marquee Lakers.

Vernon struggled early in the '89-90 season, prompting Lis to fire Gare and promote Johnstone just before Christmas. The Lakers responded by winning 11 of their first 12 games under Johnstone.

The Lakers won the Interior title, but bowed to the New Westminster Royals in the final.

Before a sellout crowd and TSN cameras, Cam Sylven scored on a breakaway in sudden-death overtime to give Vernon its first Centennial Cup win.

A year later, the Lakers finished third in the Interior but stopped Kelowna Spartans in the division semifinals and Chilliwack Chiefs in the final.

Vernon then brushed back Powell River Paper Kings for the Nat Bailey Cup (BCJHL) and Prince George Spruce Kings for the Mowat Cup.

The Lakers, paced by scoring wizard Jason Elders (now attending the University of Denver on a scholarship) defeated Calgary Royals to advance to the Centennial Cup in Sudbury, Ont.

Goalie Murray Caton was solid, while forwards Drew Sawtell, Phil Esposito, Rob Shypita, Terry Klapstein and Longstaff handled most of the offence in Vernon's second straight Centennial Cup triumph.

In 91'-92, the Lakers finished fourth with a solid 34-23-3 record before again knocking off Kelowna and Chilliwack in the Interior playoffs.

Vernon swept the Bellingham Ice Hawks in the BCJHL final and Prince George in the Mowat series.

The Lakers beat Winkler Flyers in round robin Centennial Cup play, also the Abbot Cup final. Winkler stopped Vernon in semifinal action before losing to Thunder Bay in the final.



VERNON JUNIOR HOCKEY HIGHLIGHTS:

- League scoring leader John Price (54-79-133), Ernie Gare (50-83-133) and Wayne Dye (55-50-105) helped the Essos win the 1971-72 league championship. Vernon beat Penticton 4-3 in the finals.
- Tom Serviss of the Essos won the 1967-68 scoring title (25-65-90). He's the only defenceman ever to win the scoring trophy.
- Wayne Dye of the Essos won the '69-70 scoring championship (38-46-84).
- Jim Lawrence of the Essos won the '70-71 scoring title (41-86-127).
- The team took a one-year leave of absence from the BCJHL ('79-80 season).
- Former Laker Dane
 Jackson signed an NHL
 contract with the
 Vancouver Canucks this
 season. Jackson started
 the season with Hamilton
 of the American League.



1992-93 Scouting Report: B.C. Junior Hockey League

OUNGER, BIGGER, FASTER. That's the theme for most line-ups as the B.C. Junior Hockey League skates into its 32nd campaign.

League governors chose to limit the number of 20 year olds to six, a move designed to attract more NHL scouts and prevent teams from stacking rosters with overage talent.

BCJHL president Ron Boileau expects to surpass last year's recordsetting attendance figure of 300,000 with a faster brand of hockey.

"We have to showcase our talent more," said Boileau. "We have to get away from our clutch and grab tactics, so you'll see more stick infractions called this year."

"Knock off the Vernon Lakers" is the No. 1 goal for most teams, including the Kelowna Spartans, playoff losers to Vernon the past two seasons.

Here's how the Laker's nine opponents look for 1992-93:

Interior Division

KELOWNA SPARTANS

Players to Watch

American winger Steffon Walby is the league's premier showcase player this year. Head coach Jim Hammett says of Walby: "He's worth the price of admission." Czech Martin Masa showed splendid offensive talent in the first six weeks of regular season. Snipers Steve Roberts, Darren Tymchyshyn and Curtis Fry and blueliner Pavel Suchanek are solid contributors.

Outlook

With an energized home crowd behind them, the Spartans won't lose many games at Memorial. Hammett is a superb motivator and with eight returnees seeking playoff revenge, his club will be mentally tough.

PENTICTON PANTHERS

Players to Watch

All-star Jeff Tory is the league's top blueliner. He's a big part of a small team blessed with Hurricane Andrewlike speed. David Kilduff is an all-star goalie who stoned the Spartans on Kelowna ice early this season. Up front, slick Czech Marcel Sakac, feisty Tyler Boucher and flashy rookie Brendan Morrison are keepers.

Outlook

Gary Davidson is a well respected head coach known for strong teaching skills. The Panthers could get knocked around again come the post-season, but speed and experience could help them overcome an early exit.

CHILLIWACK CHIEFS

Players to Watch

The Swedish trio of Thomas Kraft, Knut Enquvist and Johan Ahrgren will be forced to adjust quickly to the BCJHL's physical style. Experienced forwards Clint Black, Brad Loring, Jason Sanford and Doug Ast need to have career years for the Chiefs to succeed. Paul Nicolls is the best of the blueline brigade. Top rookies are Jeff Grabinsky and Bryce Munroe.

Outlook

Goalie Bryan Scheibel, obtained in a September trade with Nanaimo, needs a consistent season. Rookie head coach Donneau Menard will have to work on trimming his early season goals against record. Will have to battle hard for final playoff spot.

MERRITT CENTENNIALS

Players to Watch

Tom Mix, who produced 90 points with Fernie Ghostriders of the Rocky Mountain Junior Hockey League, will lead the Cents' offence. Top supporting cast includes forwards Guy Prince, Joe



Rybar and Brian Zakall and defenceman Aaron Hoffman. Goalie Dan Morrisey is back after a 31-game season last year.

Outlook

Scott Farrell is a keen, first-year BCJHL coach after guiding Fernie a year ago. He's only 22 so may have problems distancing himself from his players. Veteran General Manager Brian Barrett helped save the franchise last summer and he badly needs a playoff series or two this season.

Coastal Division

POWELL RIVER PAPER KINGS

Players to Watch

Head coach Kent Lewis calls super Swede Stefan Brannare "a Junior A Pavel Bure." Brannare will combine with 51-goal scorer Heath Dennison and Ryan Douglas on the league's most explosive forward unit. Highly touted Chad Wilson paces the Kings' defensive corps, while goalie Chad Vizzutti will get the bulk of work. Forwards Brent Berry and Robbie Gordon will also produce offensively.

Outlook

Lewis was a tireless worker in his junior days (Victoria Cougars-Nanaimo Clippers) and his team will show the same character. Tough on home ice. Paper Kings should win the division.

VICTORIA WARRIORS

Players to Watch

Vince Devlin and John Murgatroyd will be among the league's top pointgetters. David Hebky scored some key goals in the early going after getting 16 goals with Victoria Cougars a year ago.

NANAIMO CLIPPERS

Players to Watch

Casey Hungle, Jason Disiewich and Jade Kersey will pump up the volume on offence. Shawn York has track meet speed and the knack for key goals. Ex-Panthers Phil Valk and Brian Veale head a mediocre backline crew. Hot rookies include former Clipper stickboy Brent Murcheson and Chris Buie.

Outlook

Head coach Bill Hardy went full out every shift as a junior (Clippers-Richmond Sockeyes) and demands the same from his players. Goaltenders Dan Murphy and Jason Wood will have to enjoy all-star seasons if Nanaimo is to challenge for pennant.

SURREY EAGLES

Players to Watch

Left winger Al Kinisky was a thirdround draft choice of Philadelphia flyers in 1990. The six foot four, 217 pounder was a force in an upset win over Vernon Sept. 25 in Surrey. Scott Boucher, rookie-of-the-year with Abbotsford (Junior B) last season, and returnees Rvan Donovan and Kevin Robertson can all score. Defenceman Cal Benazic was the BCJHL's first week MVP.

Outlook

Second-year head coach Pat Smith has four returnees on defence and he's high on 15 year old backliner Geoff White of Quesnel. The Eagles fly on their Olympic-sized home ice, but will have to win more on the road (six wins last year) for playoff glory.

BELLINGHAM ICE HAWKS

Players to Watch

High scoring forward Tom Wittenberg was trying to do it alone as this article went to press. However, help was on its way as the Ice Hawks hired a new coach and assistant GM in late September. Returning goalie Wes Rudy is decent and forwards Dave Kirkpatrick and Don Barr can play. Rugged James Pelzer and towering blueliner Gary Goulash will lead the hit parade.

Outlook

After new owner Paul Flett fired coach GM Tim Racine in pre-season, the Ice Hawks could have been had for an order of chicken wings. Things changed when Greg Cyr was named coach and Dennis Pisiak hired as assistant GM. Both men have good hockey connections and vowed to turn the Ice Hawks around. They'll need to work fast.



The 1992-93 Vernon Lakers



l Paterson hardly took a conservative approach in his first major task as Vernon Lakers' general manager.

He gambled by scheduling seven of the Lakers' first eight games on the road. Vernon won five of those games to make Paterson look like somewhat of a genius.

"That's exactly where I hoped we'd be when I took the gamble to play that many road games so early in the year, said Paterson, who resigned as GM Thanksgiving Monday, and is now handling team promotions.

"This way, the tough part is more or less over in terms of grueling travel."

The Lakers' 747 start had them battling the Penticton Panthers for first place in the Interior Division at Thanksgiving.

Paterson was thrilled with his club's showing through the 10-game mark.

"We're strong in goal and I think we have strength down the middle," he said. "Our powerplay is looking sharp and our defence is all right.

"We could use a couple of right wingers and we've got a few irons in the fire."

With exception of a 7-2 thrashing Oct. 2 in Nanaimo, the Lakers had a legitimate shot at winning each of their first 10 contests.

Paterson was excited about the coaches he and owner Duncan Wray hired – head coach Rob Bremner and assistant John Cameron.

"I think we picked the right two guys there," said Paterson. "They're doing a great job."

In goal, the Lakers will rely on Jason Chipman for prime time service this season. Back-up Chris Godard, who saw 31 minutes of action through 10 tilts, will play eight or nine games in his first year of apprenticeship.

"I'm having a good time here," said Chipman, employed as an electrician with Kal West. "I want to help out the team and maybe go somewhere if I can. I'd like a pro tryout."

On defence, the Lakers are basically a stay-at-home bunch led by a rejuvenated veteran Greg Buchanan (four goals in first 10

When the going gets tough...

Lakers Learn Responsibility

The Vernon Lakers began their season on a responsible note.

Team management recently brought in CIBC regional Youth Traffic and Safety Programs Coordinator Chris Gibson from Kelowna to lecture the local juniors on the potential hazards of drinking and driving.

Team coach Rob Bremner believes this type of program should be held at the beginning of each hockey season.

"I've always felt strongly about the issue and now I have a chance to do something about it," said Bremner. "It's important that our guys are made aware of all the dangers involved."

Gibson says the Lakers fit perfectly into his target audience.

"I usually speak to entire schools in an auditorium but I jumped at the chance to talk to a junior hockey team for two reasons," he explained. "The first being they fit into our target group (men 16-24 years) and they also have such a high profile in the community."

The ICBC presentation began by focusing on the emotional, financial, and legal aspects of the crime.

"When someone thinks of what would happen if they were involved in a drinking and driving situation they usually only think of the possible damage to themselves or their vehicle," he explained. "I want to make them aware of the whole picture and how it would effect them over the long term."

Gibson explained to the Vernon players that a liability claim could wipe them out financially while the criminal aspect itself is also a deterrent.

"Being convicted of driving while impaired could have serious effects on a young hockey player's career," he said. "A criminal record could potentially keep you out of certain countries and these players do not want to have their options

limited by a conviction."

Gibson also showed the Vernon players a brief but graphic slide presentation detailing accidents involving driving while intoxicated.

While some people believe this graphic approach is little more than shock therapy Gibson is quick to defend it.

"It's shocking but it's also reality," he said. "Most young people don't see this type of accident or believe they could ever be involved but it happens and if showing these slides shocks someone into being responsible, than I say it's worth it."

Gibson hopes his presentation will help the Lakers and the community as a whole.

"These players have such a high profile in the community that just by setting a good example they could really make a difference since their peers respect them and they are looked up to by those younger than them."
