SOME NEW RULES FOR HOCKEY, 1953-54

BOARD CHECKING (Boarding)

A minor or major penalty, at the discretion of the referee based upon the degree of violence of the impact with the boards, shall be imposed on any player who body checks, cross checks, elbows, charges or trips an opponent in such a manner that causes the opponent to be thrown violently into the boards. . . .

ELBOWING AND KNEEING

A minor penalty shall be imposed on any player who uses his elbows or knees in such a manner as to in any way foul an opponent. . . .

(b) Injury caused to an opponent by elbowing or kneeling shall incur a major penalty. . . . NOTE—The referee shall deal strictly with this rule and a major penalty should be given when warranted. . . .

INTERFERENCE

(a) A minor penalty shall be imposed on a player who interferes with or impedes the progress of an opponent, who is not in possession of the puck, or who deliberately

knocks a stick out of an opponent's hands or who prevents an opponent who has lost his stick or dropped his stick, from regaining possession of it.

NOTE—Defending players are entitled to "stand their ground" or "shadow" attacking players. Players of the team in possession shall not be permitted to "run interference" for the puck carrier.

(b) Unless the puck is in the goal crease area, a player of the attacking team not in possession may not stand in the goal crease or on the goal crease line or hold his stick in the goal crease while such a condition prevails a goal shall not be allowed, and the face-off shall be at the nearest face-off spot in the neutral zone. . . .

OBSCENE OR PROFANE LANGUAGE

(a) Players must not use profane language at one another on the ice, nor use obscene or profane language to spectators.

(b) For violation of this rule, a ten minute misconduct penalty may be imposed at the discretion of the referee. . . .

We all know what to expect when the Warwicks take the ice, and so far this year no crowd in the Valley has ever been disappointed. They have a rough, tough team hitting on all six right now, and will be out to add those two points to their year's total.

Player Profiles . . . Bill Tarnow

Another fourth-year man and one of the many family men on the club is that right winger, Bill Tarnow.

Bill came here to Vernon after playing a lot of hockey for the Kimberley Dynamiters in the Kootenays, being well up in the scoring race down there in 1948.

Tarnow started his hockey career in Calgary, playing the 1937-38 season in peewee hockey with the New York Americans, a club with N.H.L. names in minor big league style. The 1938-39 year was spent with the same team, but in 1939-40 he graduated to the Calgary Argos, a midget team, who went on to win the Southern Alberta championship and then were beaten out in the finals for the Alberta title by the famed Edmonton Athletic Club team. Bill stayed with the Argos for the next two seasons, winding up with the Calgary Royals in junior hockey, again being beaten by Edmonton for the Alberta title, Dave Duchak being coach for the Royals that year. In March, 1942, Bill, like many other Canadian boys, decided to do his bit for Canada and joined up in the Canadian Navy, where he served four years in the European theatre on sub. patrol duty.

Bill returned to hockey and played for the Navy Vets in the Big Four League in Calgary. This was mainly a city league made up of former hockey stars and the juniors on their way up. Bill spent the 45-46 and 46-47 seasons with this club, then went to the Buffalo training camp of the A.H.L., being held in Saskatoon under Leroy Goldsworthy, and from there was sent to Coley Hall's Vancouver Canucks, and from there to the Kimberley Dynamiters. In 1947 Tarnow played with the Dynamiters who won the league championship but were defeated by the Trail Smokeeaters for the B.C. title. 48-49 and the 49-50 years were all spent with Kimberley, with Bill always finishing high up in the league scoring race.

Last year Bill potted 26 goals for Vernon, and should have another good year in 1953-54. A knee injury received in practice a week or so ago has kept him out of the lineup. But we look to see him back in action this week.
